BRENTHAM ALLOTMENTS

Mr. J. Lewington F.R.I.C.S., the Surveyor for the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, came to Brentham on Monday 25th January to meet and discuss with interested parties the proposed appropriation of the allotments for housing purposes. Mr. Lewington acts as the technical advisor to the D.O.E. on allotment matters and therefore his opinion is hopefully followed, so it was extremely important to ensure he was presented with all the facts.

Your Chairman attended the meeting, together with representatives of the Brentham Horticultural Society, the local Allotment Association and a representative from the National Allotment Society. The local Allotment Action Group was strongly represented and a number of aggrieved plot-holders also attended. The London Borough of Ealing Parks & Amenities Group also sent a representative who was, members will be pleased to know, extremely sympathetic to our point of view.

All parties put forward their points clearly and concisely and as forcible as is possible under the circumstances. Mr. Lewington listened closely to everything that was said, asked numerous questions and made copious notes. A detailed site inspection was made and, in all, Mr. Lewington was present for the best part of two hours.

Mr. Lewington now has to report back to the D.O.E. with his recommendations, who in their turn advise the London Borough of Ealing. Unfortunately, we do not get the opportunity at this stage of seeing Mr. Lewington's report, so we must wait patiently to hear from either the D.O.E. or the L.B. of E. Keep your fingers crossed!
