The present Committee saved May Day from extinction in 1973 and, with various people moving away from the area, not to mention their children having outgrown the event, they now feel it is time some of those with younger children should take an active part for a while. One of our pianists is moving away from Ealing, and the other can no longer spare the time to play at the six weekly rehearsals and on the day itself. #### GARDEN COMPETITION

Again this year we plan to aware prizes in the autumn for the most attractive garden through the year, and it has been noted that many have already begun work. The Committee would be interested to hear residents' own views on what they find makes for an attractive garden and if you think a particular garden would be your choice for an aware, please drop a note to Pam Turner at 43 Ludlow Road.

We did promise in the last Newsletter to add something more about the gardens receiving a mention in last year's competition. The attraction of both 21A Brentham Way and 71 Fowlers Walk was the brilliance of colour; 15 Meadvale Road was also very bright, based on an unusual regiment of pots; 3 Brunswick Road was a marvellous dense carpet of colour, but a disappointment when late autumn left it bare soil underlay; 50 Fowlers Walk was neat as ever with some lovely colour combinations at times; 42 Holyoake Walk and 14 Neville Road were both very pretty in spring and perfectly in scale with their small size, but were less attractive later on; 33 Ludlow Road's attraction was also rather short lived, but worthy of mention for soft colour combination when the hollyhocks were out; 51 Ludlow Road similarly when its clematis montana was in bloom. This garden has arranged some very pleasant shapes from a most awkward corner site; 1 Meadvale Road is most attractive at the entrance but has not coped so well with its corner site in the main area; 27 Meadvale Road is a larger garden using fruit trees in traditional cottage-garden style; 47 Brentham Way was one of the few houses to use window boxes which helped to extend the tiny garden and the space available for plants.

These gardens, and those mentioned previously, were only a selection from the many others which were considered through the year. In fact, very few gardens were a real disappointment. It was not an easy task to make the short list, nor to select the winners. Please make it even harder for us this year.

#### BRENTHAM HALT ROAD

Many of you will know by now that Brentham Halt Road has ceased to exist, not only under the roadworks, but because Ealing Council have caused the name to be changed to "Westgate". Mrs. Edith Harris of 14 Neville Road, is leading a strong and successful movement to restore the rightful name, and the Committee support her fully. Mrs. Harris will no doubt welcome signatures on her petition to support her cause, and an extra copy is with the Committee.
