

GOOD BUILDING IN BRENTHAM

It is very pleasing to see a number of instances where incorrect "modifications" to houses have been reinstated again to the original design. Several house owners have put in the correct Brentham timber windows, replacing large pane picture windows and metal frames. New front doors with correct glazing and some very good timber gates have appeared, which if not exactly to the original design are very close and in the same spirit. Re-tiling and re-decorating have been done to the correct specifications.

Some extensions have faithfully followed the Brentham details and successfully merged with original terraces and groups.

This good work goes a long way to maintaining the unity of the Estate. The subtle variations of detail within that unity is its charm and this unity is so easily lost when interrupted by imported features, out of key, scale and colour.
