## THROUGH TRAFFIC

The Brentham Society committee has recently written to the Council to suggest that the through traffic which uses Pitshanger Lane, Brunner Road and Brunswick Road could be discouraged by altering junction markings at Woodfield Road and at each corner of Brunner Road and Brunswick Road in order to make through traffic give way to local traffic. We await a reply from the Council and would welcome residents' comments.

### BOLLARDS

The committee have succeeded in having the pavement reinstated outside the Brentham Club and bollards erected to prevent further damage.

We have also brought pressure to bear on the Council which has resulted in bollards being erected along the edge of the paving by the shops in Pitshanger Lane. This should not only prevent <sup>damage</sup> to the new paving by vehicles but should also add to the security of pedestrians in the area.
